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## YVES GELLIE

Yves Gellie is a French photographer. After two years of practicing medicine in Africa, he chose to devote himself to photography and photojournalism. He thus became famous by publishing a first article in Times Magazine and Paris-Match, on the clandestine cocaine laboratories in Colombia. He then worked for the Sipa and Gamma agencies, before participating in the creation of several photographers' collectives. Since 1987, he has been interested in the Middle East - Iran, Iraq, Syria and the Persian Gulf countries. He won a World Press Award for a report on Oman in 1988, and his work on Saudi Arabia earned him the Society of Publication Designer's Award and the Merit Award Winner in 2003.

Subsequently, Yves Gellie has developed a practice between photojournalism and contemporary art, exploring the ambiguous relationship between photography and reality, the fictional power of images. He regularly participates in exhibitions in France and abroad.
